













Michigan's Food and Agriculture Industry

What does it encompass?

- Leads the nation in production of 7 commodities
- -Asparagus, dry black beans, dry cranberry beans, Cucumbers, tart cherries, Niagara grapes, squash
- Employs 923,000 Michigan residents
- Nearly 22% of people working in Michigan

Michigan's food and agriculture sector contributes \$104.7 billion to Michigan's economy annually; with \$2.1 billion in exports.



- Comprised of field inspectors (food and dairy), supervisors, specialists, food service consultants, office staff.




.. Our Role

- Over 500 people work in food and dairy safety in the state at state, local or federal level.
- Work mostly with local health, MDHHS, DEQ, MDE, FDA, USDA.
- \$22M+ in direct operations + \$30M local health program
- Regulatory food and dairy safety




Food Inspector Staffing Numbers

Food Program (con't.)


- 45 Local Health Departments cover Michigan's 83 counties
- Food Service program
- Accredited
- 194 inspectors, 334 total staff
- 45,000 licensed establishments
- 100,000 inspections, investigations, plan reviews, etc. per yeai
- Primary to conduct Foodborne Illness investigations

Michigan's Dairy Industry

- Leading segment of Michigan's agriculture economy
- Annual economic impact of \$15.7 billion
- Generating nearly 40,000 jobs
- Boasting 96 dairy processing plants
- Fluid milk, yogurt, cottage cheese, sour cream, butter, milk powder, cheese and ice cream
- 6th in the nation for milk production
- 1st in pounds of milk per cow



Trends in Dairy Farming



Grade "A" and Manufacturing Milk Laws

- Grade "A" Law (Pasteurized Milk Ordinance)
- Federal requirements implemented by state programs
- MDARD's program is required to ship milk across state lines
- Manufacturing Milk Law
- State program that can vary from state to state
- Covers large and small artisanal operations

- Value, expertise, and service
- Effective turn-around on equipment certification
- Help industry meet federally mandated requirements
- Increased processing opportunities
- Inventive value-added end products



Operational Details

- Budget = \$5,439,900
- -General Fund = \$5,023,800
- -Fees = \$224,000
- -Federal funds = \$192,100
- Staff = 36 Appropriated
- -Inspectors = 19 (17 currently filled)
- -Specialists = 9
- -Supervisors/Office Staff = 8 (6 currently filled)
- -FY19 Increase
