

Dear Members of the House Insurance Committee:

I have enclosed a recent article detailing the importance of legislation (Senate Bill 447 - HIDATA) that has been referred to the House Insurance Committee.

The American Medical Association (AMA) just ranked Michigan as the 2<sup>nd</sup> least competitive state for healthcare in the county. Just three years ago, the AMA ranked Michigan as the 6th least competitive state. Last year, Michigan was ranked 3<sup>rd</sup> least competitive. Now, only the state of Alabama has a less competitive healthcare market.

The lack of competition has contributed to employers in Michigan having high health insurance premiums. Michigan small business premiums are 19% more expensive than the rest of the country and up to 28% more expensive than the most-competitive states.

Senate Bill 447 has bipartisan support and passed the Senate unanimously. The legislation empowers employers to request confidential information on claim and utilization data from their health insurers so they can be more informed about costs and trends and be in a better position to shop for future healthcare coverage for their employees.

MAHPs member health plans are declining to quote half of the bid opportunities they receive because employers do not have enough information about their prior claim and utilization history. As a result, when employers shop, they aren't shopping effectively because they're not armed with data.

Increasing transparency is a critical factor in improving competition. The HIDATA bill will help drive more competitive quotes to Michigan's employers who are paying more than national average in health insurance premiums.

For these reasons, we encourage committee members to support Senate Bill 447.


