The Chair laid HB 4015 before the committee:

HB 4015 (Rep. Lightner)

A bill to amend 1976 PA 331, entitled "Michigan consumer protection act," by amending section 3 (MCL 445.903), as amended by 2020 PA 296, and by adding section 3m.

HB 4115 (Rep. Berman)

A bill to amend 1998 PA 58, entitled "Michigan liquor control code of 1998," by amending section 1114 (MCL 436.2114), as amended by 2011 PA 27, and by adding section 1116.
