

MICHIGAN LIQUOR CONTROL COMMISSION



The Michigan Liquor Control Commission was created by the Legislature in 1933 upon the repeal of Prohibition.

The Michigan Constitution of 1963 and the Liquor Control Code empower the Commission to regulate alcoholic beverage traffic within the State of Michigan.



Under Article IV,
Section 40 of the
Michigan Constitution
of 1963, **the
Commission shall
exercise complete
control of the
alcoholic beverage
traffic within this state,**
subject to statute.



The **Michigan Liquor Control Commission** is a **Type I agency** housed within the **Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs (LARA)**.



**This act shall be construed to
effect the intent and purposes
set forth in this act and
to protect the public health,
safety, and welfare of the
citizens of this state.**

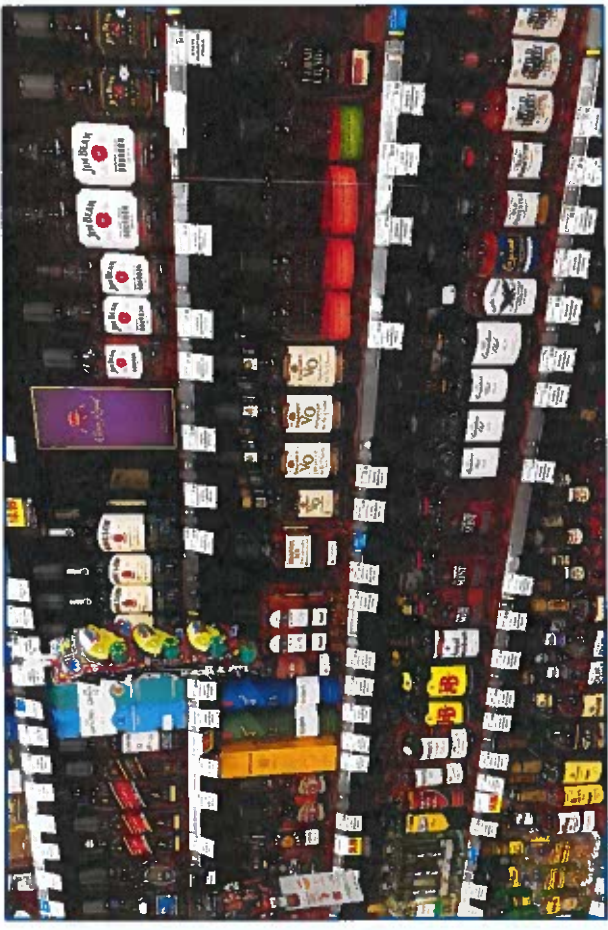

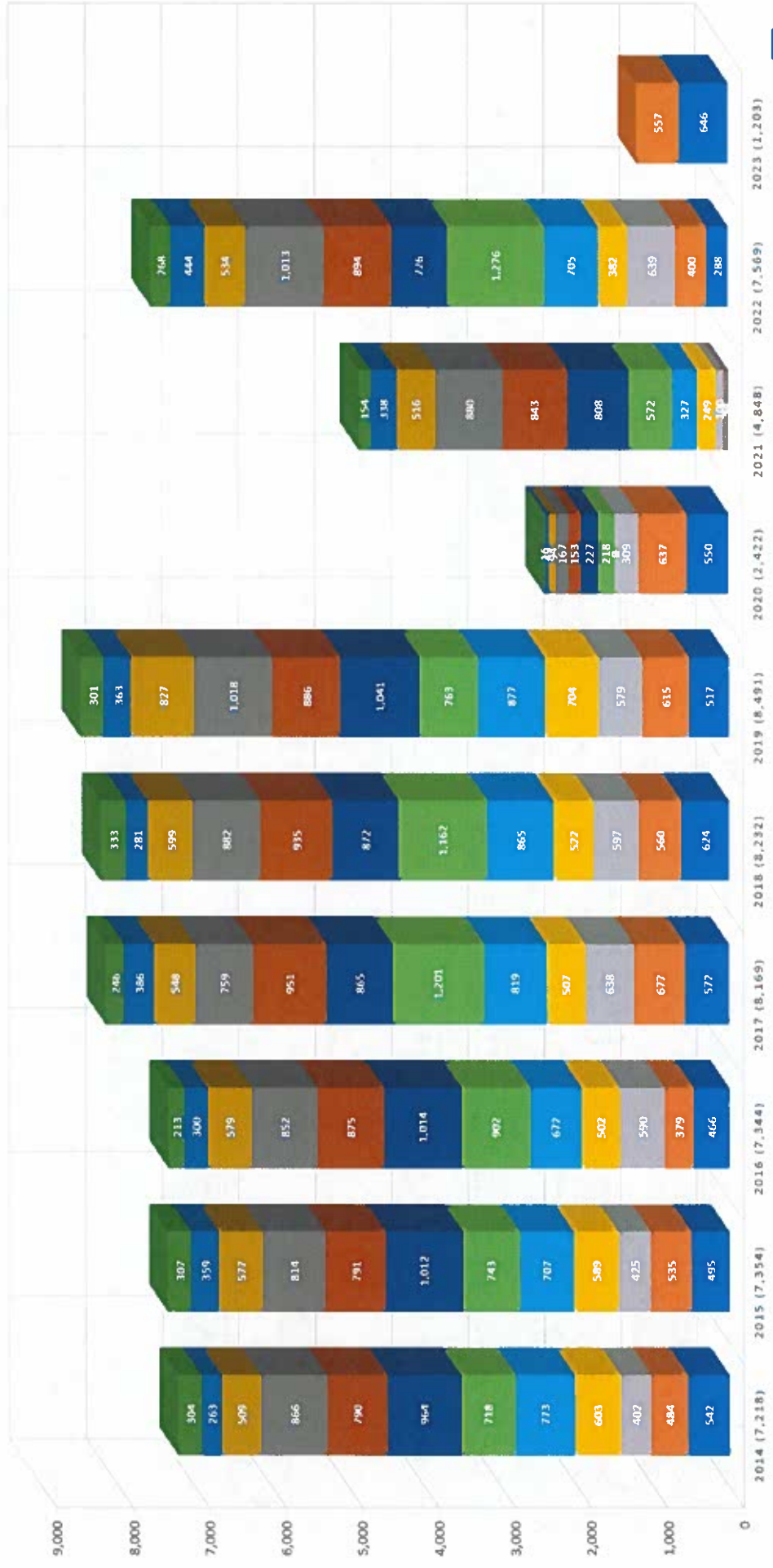


Number of Spirits SKUs Listed by MLCC

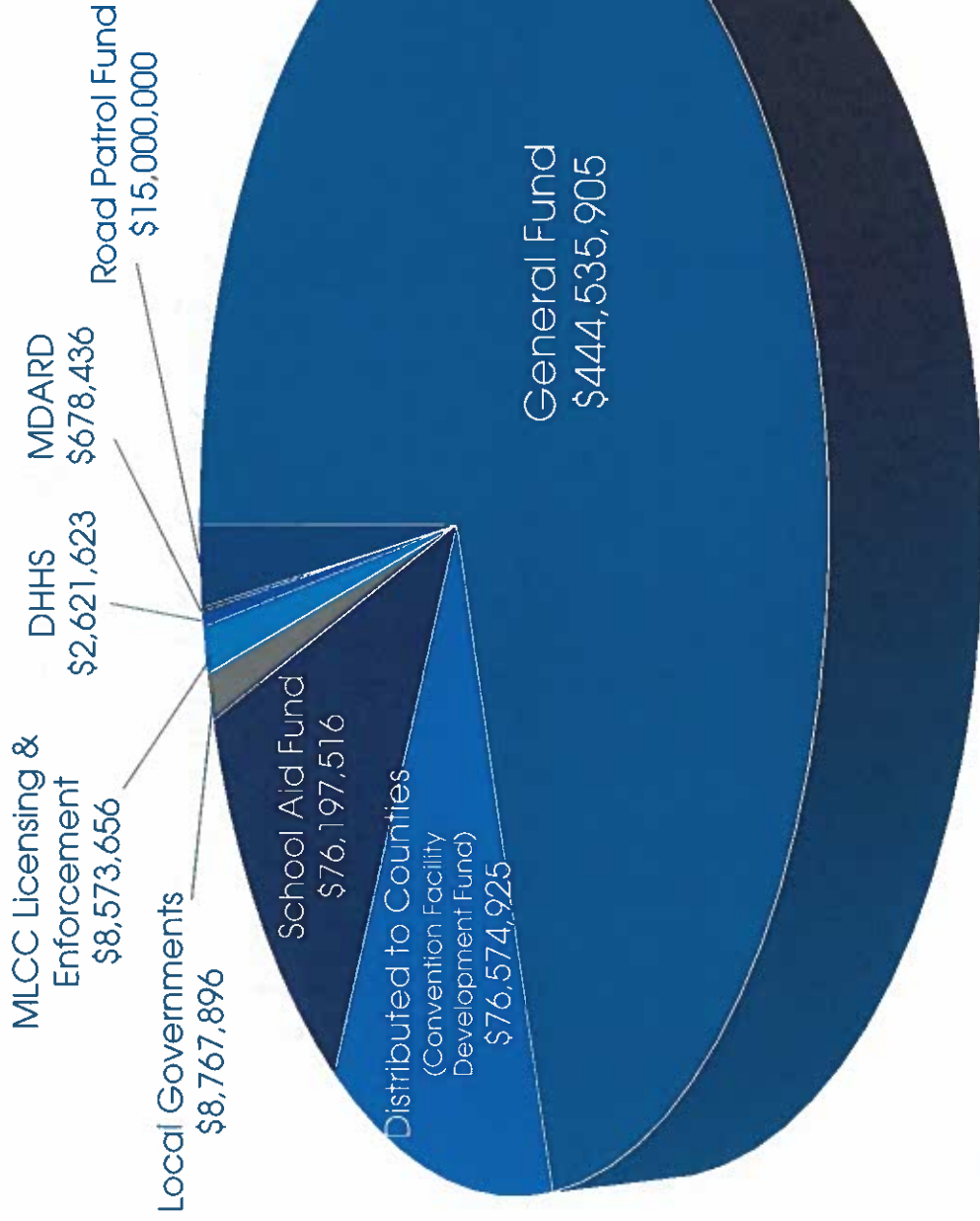

The MLCC collected total revenue of **\$633,171,437** during Fiscal Year 2022

FY 2023-24 Budget Request

- \$900,000 for SIPS+ Development from ITIF Grant
- \$900,000 for Ongoing Software System Development
- \$1,500,000 Additional Spending Authority for Local Government Grants Required by Statute
- \$514,600 for Additional FTE positions (150 total FTEs)
