The House Standing Committee on Criminal Justice was called to order by **Representative Kurt Heise**, Chair.

"Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days after the date it is enacted into law."

SB 597 (Warren) Health; occupations; training requirements for medical professionals regarding human trafficking; implement.

Representative Graves offered and moved to adopt the following amendment to **SB 593**:

1. Amend page 1, following line 8, by inserting:
“Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days after the date it is enacted into law.”.

4. Amend page 6, following line 5, by inserting:
“Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days after the date it is enacted into law.”.
