HB 5841 (Farrington) Health; occupations; intentional acts by a licensee and registrant resulting in his or her financial gain and harm to patients; allow disciplinary subcommittee to impose sanction of permanent revocation.

HB 5842 (Pettalia) Health; occupations; reinstatement of or limitation on a permanently revoked license or registration; prohibit.
