

**MINUTES OF THE COMMITTEE
ON
JUDICIARY**

The House Standing Committee on Judiciary was called to order by the Chair.

Members present: Reps. Cotter, Kesto, Heise, Johnson, LaFontaine, Leonard, Howrylak, Cavanagh, Lipton, Irwin, Clemente.

Members absent/excused: None.

Representative LaFontaine moved to approve the minutes of the December 4, 2014 meeting. There being no objection, the motion prevailed by unanimous consent.

The Chair laid SB 105, SB 106 and SB 107 before the committee:

- SB 105 (Schuitmaker) Criminal procedure; DNA; collection of DNA samples at time of arrest for committing or attempting to commit a felony offense; provide for in DNA identification profiling system.
- SB 106 (Schuitmaker) Criminal procedure; DNA; collection of DNA samples at time of arrest for committing or attempting to commit a felony offense; provide for in probate code of 1939.
- SB 107 (Jones) Criminal procedure; DNA; collection of DNA samples at time of arrest for committing a felony or attempting to commit a felony offense; provide for in Michigan penal code.

Senator Jones, Senator Schuitmaker and Sgt. Amy Dehner, representing the Michigan State Police, all testified in support of the bills. Questions and discussion followed.

- SB 783 (Jones) Health; medical marihuana; authorization of medical marihuana in certain places; restrict.

SB 1049 (Schuitmaker) Law enforcement; other: protocols that require law enforcement officers to carry opioid antagonists and requirement for law enforcement training; provide for.
