The House Standing Committee on Oversight was called to order by Representative Tom McMillin, Chair.

Members present: Representatives McMillin, Kelly, O'Brien, Leonard, Howrylak, Townsend, Robinson, and Phelps.

Members absent/excused: None.

Representative Kelly moved to adopt the minutes of May 13, 2014, as printed.

There being no objection, the motion prevailed by unanimous consent of the members present; the minutes were adopted as printed.

Chair McMillin laid the following bill before the committee:

HB 5610 (Denby) Legislature; other; journal of the senate and house of representatives; revise number of copies to be printed and bound.

Representative Denby testified in support of her bill.

Gary Randall, Clerk of the House of Representatives, testified in support of the bill.

Representative Kelly moved to report House Bill 5610 with recommendation that the bill pass.

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| HB 5081 (McMillin) | Law enforcement; reports; reports of disposition of certain forfeited property; require, and provide a penalty for failing to report. |
| HB 5250 (McMillin) | Criminal procedure; forfeiture; uniform forfeiture reporting act; enact. |
| HB 5251 (Robinson) | Criminal procedure; forfeiture; reports of disposition of certain forfeited property; amend public health code to require, and provide a penalty for failing to report. |
| HB 5252 (Callton) | Criminal procedure; forfeiture; seizure and forfeiture of property for abatement of nuisance to be reported to the department of state police under the uniform forfeiture reporting act; require. |

Sergeant Amy Dehner, representing the Michigan State Police (MSP), submitted a card in opposition to the bill package and testified that the MSP intends to continue to work with the sponsors on the bills.

Questions and discussion among the committee members followed.

Ben Bodkin, representing the Michigan Sheriffs Association, submitted a card in opposition to the bills but did not wish to speak.
