

**MINUTES OF THE COMMITTEE
ON
REGULATORY REFORM**

Tuesday, March 11, 2014

The House Standing Committee on Regulatory Reform was called to order by the Chair.

Members present: Reps. Crawford, McBroom, Denby, McMillin, LaFontaine, Rendon, Yonker, Kelly, Kesto, Haugh, Abed, Stanley, Dianda, Nathan, Schor.

Members absent/excused: None.

The Chair laid HB 4997, SB 667 and SB 668 before the committee:

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| HB 4997 | (Outman) | Tobacco; retail sales; sale of electronic cigarette or any oral device that provides vapor nicotine to minors; prohibit. |
| SB 667 | (Anderson) | Tobacco; other; electronic cigarettes; prohibit use of by minors. |
| SB 668 | (Jones) | Tobacco; retail sales; electronic cigarette; prohibit sale of to minors. |

Senator Anderson, Senator Jones, and Representative Outman testified in support of their bills. Questions and discussion followed.

The following people submitted a card in support of the bills, but did not wish to speak:

Heather Glazer, representing the American Food and Petroleum Dealers.

Polly Reber, representing Michigan Distributors and Vendors Association.

Angela Cloch, representing Tobacco-Free Michigan, submitted a card in opposition to the bills, but did not wish to speak.

Dr. Matt Davis, representing the Michigan Department of Community Health, testified with a neutral position on the bills. Questions and discussion followed.

Katherine Knoll, Judy Stewart, and Peter Ruddell, representing the American Heart Association, the American Cancer Society, and the Cancer Action Network, testified in opposition to the bills. Questions and discussion followed.

The Chair laid SB 612 and HB 5396 before the committee:

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| SB 612 | (Hopgood) | Occupations; barbers; hours of education requirement; revise. |
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HB 5396 (LaFontaine) Occupations; barbers; hours of education requirement for licensed barber colleges; revise.

Callie Collins, representing Senator Hopgood's office, submitted a card in support of SB 612, but did not wish to speak.

Frank Waters, representing the Michigan Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs, submitted a card in support of the bills, but did not wish to speak

Representative LaFontaine offered the following amendment to SB 612:

1. Amend page 3, line 2, after "**INSTRUCTION**" by striking out the balance of the subdivision and inserting "**CONCERNING SAFETY AND SANITATION, OR CONCERNING LAWS, RULES, AND REGULATIONS, REQUIRED BY THE DEPARTMENT BY RULES PROMULGATED UNDER THIS ARTICLE.**".

Representative LaFontaine moved to adopt the amendment to SB 612. The motion prevailed 13-1-1.

SB 29 (Bieda) Trade; hazardous substances; addition of bittering agent to antifreeze; require.

Representative Rendon offered the following amendment:

1. Amend page 3, line 8, after "Sec. 9." by striking out "This act does" and inserting "Sections 3 and 5 do".

Representative Rendon moved to adopt the amendment to SB 29. The motion prevailed 13-1-1.
