

**MINUTES OF THE COMMITTEE

The House Standing Committee on Regulatory Reform was called to order by the Chair.

The Chair laid HB 5317 and HB 5318 before the committee:

HB 5317 (McCready) Water; quality; testing lawn sprinkler backflow preventers; reduce frequency.

HB 5318 (McCready) Construction; plumbing; testing lawn sprinkler backflow preventers; reduce frequency.

Substitute (H-2) to HB 5318 was adopted previously on 05/06/2014.

Representative McBroom offered the following amendments to HB 5317:

1. Amend page 3, line 1, after "**EVERY**" by striking out "**3**" and inserting "**10**".
2. Amend page 3, line 2, after "**THE**" by striking out "**RESIDENTIAL LAWN SPRINKLER SYSTEM**" and inserting "**BACKFLOW PREVENTER**".
3. Amend page 3, line 3, after "**OR**" by striking out "**IT**" and inserting "**THE SPRINKLER SYSTEM**".

Representative McBroom moved to adopted the amendments to HB 5317. The motion prevailed 10-1-4.

- SB 479 (Jansen) Occupations; interior design; regulation of interior designers; repeal, and rescind administrative rules.
- SB 481 (Jansen) Occupations; foresters; regulation of foresters; repeal registration requirements and rescind administrative rules.
- SB 607 (Kahn) Occupations; ocularists; registration fee for ocularists; repeal.
