

**MINUTES OF THE COMMITTEE
ON
REGULATORY REFORM**

The House Standing Committee on Regulatory Reform was called to order by the Chair.

The Chair laid HB 5095 before the committee:

HB 5095 (McCready) Animals; animal shelters; pet shop, dog pound, and animal shelters act; modify to include large-scale commercial dog breeders and to make other general revisions.

Representative Abed moved to adopt substitute (H-2) to HB 5095. The motion prevailed 13-0-0.

project areas or development districts; clarify and provide for.

SB 484 (Jansen) Occupations; foresters; registration fee for foresters; repeal.

The Chair laid SB 704 and SB 904 before the committee:

SB 704 (Hune) Health; pharmaceuticals; compounding pharmacies; regulate, require all pharmacies, manufacturers, and wholesale distributors to designate a pharmacist in charge, and provide penalties.

SB 904 (Hune) Criminal procedure; sentencing guidelines; sentencing guidelines for felonies being created under the new regulations applicable to compounding pharmacies and violations of those regulations; enact.

Senator Hune testified in support of his bills. Questions and discussion followed.

Nicole Nystrom, representing CVS Caremark, submitted a card in opposition to the bills, but did not wish to speak.

Representative LaFontaine offered the following amendments to SB 704:

1. Amend page 16, line 27, by striking out "**REGARDING COMPOUNDING ACTIVITIES**".
2. Amend page 17, line 4, after "**STANDARDS**" by inserting "**REGARDING COMPOUNDING ACTIVITIES**".
3. Amend page 17, line 6, after "**(6)**" by striking out "**A**" and inserting "**EXCEPT FOR DISTRIBUTION WITHIN A HOSPITAL OR ANOTHER HEALTH CARE ENTITY UNDER COMMON CONTROL, A**".
4. Amend page 21, line 2, after "**EVENT.**" by inserting "**FOR THE PURPOSE OF THIS SUBSECTION, AN ADVERSE EVENT DOES NOT INCLUDE A KNOWN ALLERGIC REACTION TO A SUBSTANCE INCLUDED IN THE COMPOUND IF THE ALLERGIC REACTION IS TREATED AND RELIEVED WITH STANDARD PROTOCOL.**".

Representative LaFontaine moved to adopt the amendments to SB 704. The motion prevailed 14-0-0.
