The House Standing Committee on Regulatory Reform was called to order by the Chair.

The Chair laid HB 5419 before the committee:

HB 5419 (LaFontaine) Occupations; athletic trainers; license fee and continuing education hours for athletic trainers; modify, and require training on use of automated external defibrillator.

Representative LaFontaine moved to adopt substitute (H-1) to HB 5419. The motion prevailed 13-0-0.
