The House Standing Committee on Regulatory Reform was called to order by the Chair.

The Chair laid HB 5513 before the committee:

HB 5513 (Schor) Mobile homes; other; manufactured housing reforms; specify remedies for health and safety violations and provide other reforms.

Representative Schor testified in support of his bill. Questions and discussion followed.

Linda Vail, representing the Ingham County Health Department, testified in support of the bill. Questions and discussion followed.

The Chair laid HB 4935 before the committee:

HB 4935 (Heise) Liquor; licenses; penalties and licensing sanctions for critical violations; increase.

Representative Heise and Al Cox, representing the City of Plymouth, testified in support of the bill.

Andy Deloney, Chairman of the Michigan Liquor Control Commission, testified with a neutral position on the bill.

Scott Ellis, representing the Michigan Licensed Beverage Association, testified in opposition to the bill.

Marie Hansen, representing the Michigan Alcohol Policy Promoting Health and Safety, submitted a card in support of the bill, but did not wish to speak.

Leigh Jameson-Heise, representing the Lenawee Substance Abuse Prevention, submitted a card on the bill, but did not wish to speak.
