MINUTES OF THE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

April 21, 2016

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| HB 5409 (Liberati) | Education; discipline; statement of findings and intent regarding state policy on schoolwide positive intervention and support plans; provide for. |
| HB 5410 (Liberati) | Education; discipline; department of education to develop state policy establishing a schoolwide positive behavioral intervention and support plan; require. |
| HB 5411 (Greig) | Education; discipline; certain requirements for state policy on schoolwide positive behavioral intervention and support plan; provide for. |
| HB 5412 (Price) | Education; discipline; restrictions on use of seclusion and restraint; require to be included in state policy on schoolwide positive intervention and support plans. |
| HB 5413 (Vaupel) | Education; discipline; requirements for documentation and reporting; require to be included in state policy on schoolwide positive intervention and support plans. |
| HB 5414 (Price) | Education; discipline; certain provisions concerning emergency intervention; require to be included in state policy on schoolwide positive behavioral intervention and support plans. |
| HB 5415 (Tedder) | Education; discipline; certain provisions concerning data collection; require to be included in state policy on schoolwide positive behavioral intervention and support plans. |

- HB 5416 (Heise) Education; discipline; certain provisions concerning training; require to be included in state policy on schoolwide positive behavioral intervention and support plans.
- HB 5417 (Greig) Education; discipline; definitions for state policy on schoolwide positive behavioral intervention and support plans; provide for.
- HB 5418 (Tedder) Education; discipline; policy concerning schoolwide positive behavioral intervention and support; require nonpublic schools to adopt and implement.
