HOUSE STANDING COMMITTEE ON HEALTH POLICY

Tuesday, November 29th, 2016 9:00 a.m. Room 519 House Office Building

Representative Callton, Chair, called the meeting to order.

Chair Callton requested attendance be called to establish a quorum of the appointed committee members:

Representative Vaupel moved to approve the minutes from the November 9th, 2016 meeting.

There being no objection, the motion was approved by unanimous consent.

The Chair laid SB 1015 and SB 1016 before the committee:

SB 1015 (Warren) Health occupations; health care professionals; licensure program for practice of applied behavioral analysis (ABA); establish.

SB 1016 (O'Brien) Health occupations; health care professionals; Michigan board of behavioral analysts; create.

Lt. Governor Brian Calley, Senator Warren, and Senator O'Brien, testified in support of the bills.
