MINUTES OF THE COMMITTEE
ON
CRIMINAL JUSTICE

Tuesday, November 3, 2015 9:00 a.m. Room 327 House Office Building

The House Standing Committee on Criminal Justice was called to order by the Chair.

Members present: Reps. Heise, Webber, Howrylak, Afendoulis, Lucido, Guerra, Hovey-Wright, Chang.

Members absent/excused: None.

Representative Webber moved to adopt the October 27, 2015 minutes. There being no objection, the motion prevailed by unanimous consent.

The Chair laid SB 427 before the committee:

SB 427 (Hansen) Torts; other; "Good Samaritan" law; expand to include licensed emergency medical service provider.

Senator Hansen testified in support of his bill. Questions and discussion followed.

The following people submitted a card in support of the bill, but did not wish to speak:

Kathy Wahl, representing the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services.

Representative Lucido moved to report SB 427 with recommendation. The motion prevailed 8-0-0.

The Chair laid HB 4866, HB 4867, and HB 4868 before the committee:

HB 4866 (Heise) Corrections; other; prohibition against use of unmanned aerial vehicles within 1,500 feet of a correctional facility; provide regulations for.

HB 4867 (Heise) Criminal procedure; sentencing guidelines; sentencing guidelines for operating unmanned aerial vehicles within 1,500 feet of correctional facility; enact.

HB 4868 (Heise) Aeronautics; other; use of unmanned aerial vehicles; criminalize certain uses.

Chairman Heise testified in support of his bills. Questions and discussion followed.

Sgt. Tim Fitzgerald and Sgt. Matt Rogers, both representing the Michigan State Police, testified in support of the bills. Questions and discussion followed.

David Baxter, representing himself, testified on the bills. Questions and discussion followed.

Kyle Kaminski, representing the Michigan Department of Corrections, testified with a neutral position on the bills.

John Dulmes, representing the Michigan Chemistry Council, testified with a neutral position on the bills. Questions and discussion followed.

Brian Sadek, representing the Wayne County Airport Authority, testified with a neutral position on the bills. Questions and discussion followed.

Ben Bodkin, representing the Michigan's Sheriffs' Association, submitted a card in support of the concept, but did not wish to speak.

There being no further business before the committee, the Chair adjourned the meeting at 10:27 a.m.
