Oil & Gas Program


- Oversee 20,000 active wells
- Respond to 100 spills annually
- Issue 80 new permits annually

















Revenue Scenario

- Based on best available national projections, \$4 million general fund is still needed
- If prices were to double, projected revenue might nearly cover core program costs but it would not restore the \$7 million target fund balance as established in statute.

- Part 215 Public Highway Cleanup






Leaking Underground Storage Tank Program Funding

- One cent per gallon on refined petroleum products sold for resale or consumption in the state
- Generates over \$50 million
 - First \$20 million goes into Underground Storage
 Tank Cleanup fund for the part 215 programs
 - Remaining revenue is deposited in the refined petroleum fund
