RE: Legislative Transfer Package 2019-4

Attached are legislative transfers proposed by the State Budget Office in a letter dated June 5, 2019. Pursuant to section 393 of the Management and Budget Act, a legislative transfer must be approved by a majority of both the House and Senate Appropriations Committees, with identical funding sources and dollar amounts, in order to become effective.

There are two basic types of legislative transfers, which have different effects on the overall level of appropriations in the state budget.

A **standard legislative transfer** shifts existing spending authorization between line items in a particular budget area, with no net change in total appropriations. Generally, such transfers are proposed when expenditures are higher than originally anticipated in one line item and lower than anticipated in another. These transfers can represent a shift of GF/GP funding between two line items, or merely a shift of spending authorization from same broad category of funding (federal, restricted, etc.) between the line items.

As shown in the attached table, standard transfers in this package total \$33.3 million, which will shift 0.06% of total appropriations within the existing FY 2018-19 year-to-date state budget.

A **contingency fund transfer** increases total line item appropriations in a budget area by moving contingency spending authorization from the boilerplate section of a budget act to a specific line item in order to recognize additional federal, private, local, or state restricted revenue that has become available since the original enactment of the budget. Absent the contingency fund transfer mechanism, this type of budget adjustment would be made through a supplemental appropriation bill.

As shown in the attached table, contingency fund transfers in this package total \$6.2 million, which will increase the FY 2018-19 year-to-date state budget by 0.01%.

This transfer would provide \$500,000 in federal authorization to the Child Development and Care Contracted Services line item for child care quality initiatives, and MDE has estimated that the TEACH scholarship program will lapse at least \$500,000 in federal authorization in FY 2018-19. Boilerplate in 2018 PA 207 of 2018 Article VI section 1003(2) requires all contracts for early childhood systems planning to be bid out through a statewide request-for-proposal process, and, in compliance with legislative boilerplate, the contracts have been bid out. The current contract for early childhood systems planning goes to a singular statewide entity, but the new contract would be split between the statewide entity and four regional entities. This is a one-time transition cost to shift resources from the singular statewide contract to a new regional based contract system. Without this transfer, approved early childhood systems planning contracts will not be fully funded, and the excess authorization in the TEACH scholarship program line item will lapse at the end of the fiscal year. According to the State Budget Office, this transfer is requested by July 1, 2019.

This transfer would provide \$112,800 in state restricted contingency authorization for the Michigan Schools for the Deaf and Blind Operations line item to align authorization with anticipated revenues. The increased authorization will allow the Michigan School for the Deaf and Blind to use all Medicaid funds available for audiology, nursing, physical therapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy, and counseling services provided to students attending the school. Spending authority is available from state restricted contingency authorization in accordance with 2018 PA 207, Article VI, Section 210(2). According to the State Budget Office, this transfer is requested by September 1, 2019.

This transfer request provides \$750,000 in private contingency fund authorization to align with anticipated increases in private revenues in the Medical Services Administration line item.

\$500,000 in private funds are for the development of an integrated, statewide directory and consumer management system housed within the Michigan Health Information Network (MiHIN). Funding will link MiHIN systems for patient health data sharing, provider health data sharing, and clinical reporting and storage. Private funds, awarded by the Michigan Health Endowment Fund, will be federally matched to support this 2-year, \$5.0 million development project. Ongoing maintenance costs are estimated to be between \$300,000 - \$400,000 Gross (\$75,000 - \$100,000 GF/GP).

\$250,000 in private funds will support a study of managed long-term care services and supports, as required by 2018 PA 207, Article X, Section 1510. Funding sources include \$150,000 from the Michigan Health Endowment Fund and \$100,000 from other private sources. Section 1510 also requires the department to match these private funds with up to \$100,000 GF/GP.

This transfer request increases state restricted spending authorization for Health Systems Fees in the Bureau of Community and Health Systems line item by \$600,000 to offset a one-time reduction in Medicare support (CFDA 93.777). Funds will be used to cover the operations of the Federal Survey and Certification Division in the regulation of several different federally certified health care providers and suppliers. Spending authority is available from state restricted contingency authorization in accordance with 2018 PA 207, Article XIII, Section 210(2), and sufficient revenues exist within Health Systems Fees. This transfer is requested by June 28, 2019.

This transfer request increases state restricted spending authorization in the Michigan Agency for Energy line item by \$310,000 to support expenditures from a prioryear grant award and to cover unanticipated one-time employee payout costs. This transfer request increases state restricted spending authorization in the Medical Marihuana Facilities, Licensing, and Tracking Program (MMFLTP) by \$900,000 to allow the program to support additional staff and expand resources in order to effectively regulate the state's medical marihuana facilities in accordance with the Medical Marihuana Facilities Licensing Act (2016 PA 281). The department's FY 2018-19 appropriation for the MMFLP was set at \$10.0 million, with an understanding that additional funding (supported through existing state restricted revenues) would potentially be required as the program matured and demand in the state's new medical marihuana marketplace increased. Spending authority is available from state restricted contingency authorization in accordance with 2018 PA 207, Article XIII, Section 210(2), and sufficient revenues exist within the Marihuana Regulatory Fund. This transfer would shift federal contingency fund authorization to the National Guard Operations line for reimbursement for equipment used during interstate response to Hurricane Florence. The Michigan Army National Guard mobilized six personnel and a Blackhawk helicopter to support relief efforts. FEMA funding will reimburse costs for helicopter usage and field rations. Spending authority is available from federal contingency authorization in accordance with 2018 PA 207, Article XIV, Section 210(1).

The Marine Passenger Service line item provides capital assistance for marine passenger transit systems in this state. By practice, the funding has been granted equally to two recognized marine passenger agencies: Beaver Island Transportation Authority (BITA), and Eastern Upper Peninsula Transportation Authority (EUPTA). State grant funding provides 90% of project cost with 10% provided by the local agency. This transfer would provide an additional \$50,000 in spending authority by drawing from "local contingency funds" authorization in Section 210(3) of 2018 PA 207.

The transfer would authorize the department to expend local funds (the 10% required local match) related to two Marine Passenger capital authorizations. The BITA project authorization was included in State Transportation Commission contact exhibits dated 2/19/2019 (Item #13); the EUPTA project authorization was included in State Transportation Commission contact exhibits dated 3/18/2019 (Item #7). These authorizations involve safety-related and other upgrades to existing vessels, as well as dockside improvements.

This transfer shifts \$9.0 million of State Trunkline Fund authorization from State Trunkline Federal Aid and Road & Bridge Construction to State Trunkline Operations. This transfer requests \$130,000 in state restricted contingency authorization for the Purchased Lands payment in lieu of taxes (PILT) appropriation line item with financing from the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund (MNRTF). The additional authority would enable the Department of Treasury to make Purchased Lands PILT distributions to local governments based on current land valuations on behalf of the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) for properties owned by the state and controlled by the DNR. The shortfall is due to underestimating the value of MNRTF Purchased Lands PILT throughout the state. Under 2012 PA 604, if the state fails to make PILT distributions in full, the unpaid portion would be subject to penalties and interest.
