This transfer would provide \$150,000 in federal authorization to the Child Development and Care Contracted Services line item for child care quality initiatives, and MDE has estimated that the TEACH scholarship program will lapse at least \$150,000 in federal authorization in FY 2018-19. Boilerplate in 2018 PA 207 of 2018 Article VI section 1003(2) requires all contracts for early childhood systems planning to be bid out through a statewide request-for-proposal process, and, in compliance with legislative boilerplate, the contracts have been bid out. The current contract for early childhood systems planning goes to a singular statewide entity, but the new contract would be split between the statewide entity and four regional entities. This is a one-time transition cost to shift resources from the singular statewide contract to a new regional based contract system. Without this transfer, approved early childhood systems planning contracts will not be fully funded, and the excess authorization in the TEACH scholarship program line item will lapse at the end of the fiscal year.

This transfer request provides \$750,000 in private contingency fund authorization to align with anticipated increases in private revenues in the Medical Services Administration line item.

\$500,000 in private funds are for the development of an integrated, statewide directory and consumer management system housed within the Michigan Health Information Network (MiHIN). Funding will link MiHIN systems for patient health data sharing, provider health data sharing, and clinical reporting and storage. Private funds, awarded by the Michigan Health Endowment Fund, will be federally matched to support this 2-year, \$5.0 million development project. Ongoing maintenance costs are estimated to be between \$300,000 - \$400,000 Gross (\$75,000 - \$100,000 GF/GP).

\$250,000 in private funds will support a study of managed long-term care services and supports, as required by 2018 PA 207, Article X, Section 1510. Funding sources include \$150,000 from the Michigan Health Endowment Fund and \$100,000 from other private sources. Section 1510 also requires the department to match these private funds with up to \$100,000 GF/GP.

Article VIII, Section 952(5) of 2018 PA 618 states, "The unexpended funds appropriated in part 1 for city, village, and township revenue sharing and the county incentive program shall be available for expenditure under the program for financially distressed cities, villages, or townships after the approval of transfers by the legislature pursuant to section 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393."

City, Village, and Township Revenue Sharing (CVTRS) and County Incentive Program (CIP) funds are available due to eligible units not qualifying for some or all of their payments. Specifically, there were 11 cities, 43 villages, 15 townships, and 1 county that failed to qualify for some, or all, of its incentive payment. The Financially Distressed Cities, Villages, or Townships grant program supports grant funding to cities, villages, or townships with one or more conditions that indicate probable financial distress to pay for specific projects, services, or strategies that move a local unit toward financial stability. This transfer is requested as part of FY 2018-19 book closing.
