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GLOSSARY Frequently-Used State Budget Terms

Adjusted Gross

Total net amount of all line item gross appropriations less (or minus) interdepartmental grants (IDGs) and intradepartmental transfers (IDTs)

Boilerplate

Specific language sections contained in an appropriations act which direct, limit or restrict line item expenditures, and/or require reports

Budget Stabilization Fund (BSF)

The countercyclical economic and budget stabilization fund—also known as the "rainy day" fund

Federal Revenues

Federal grant or matchable revenues dedicated to specific programs

General Fund/General Purpose (GF/GP)

The state's primary operating fund; the portion of the state's General Fund that does not include restricted revenues

Gross Appropriations (Gross)

The total of all applicable line item spending authorizations

Interdepartmental Grant (IDG)

Revenue or funds received by one state department from another state department (usually for a service the receiving department provides)

Intradepartmental Transfer (IDT)

Transfers or funds being provided from one appropriation unit to another in the same department

Lapses

Unspent/unobligated funds remaining in line item accounts at the end of the fiscal year

Line Items

Specific funding amount in an appropriations bill which establishes spending authorization for a particular program or function (may be for a single purpose or for multiple purposes)

Local Revenue

Revenues from local units of government

State Restricted (Restricted Funds)

State revenue dedicated to a specific fund; revenue which results from state mandates or initiatives; used for used for specific programs pursuant to the Constitution or statute

Private Funds

Revenues from non-government entities such as rents, royalties or interest payments, payments from hospitals, payments from individuals, and gifts and bequests

School Aid Fund (SAF)

The primary funding source for K-12 schools and Intermediate School Districts (ISDs)

Work Project

An account established to allow for certain specific unspent funds to be carried over from one fiscal year to a succeeding fiscal year or years

SECTION 109: LAW ENFORCEMENT

The Law Enforcement Division, through the use of commissioned peace officers, is responsible for enforcing environmental protection and resource management laws, conducting investigations to support environmental lawsuits for cleanups and cost recovery, and conducting criminal investigations into violations of all natural resource and environmental protection laws. The Division enforces game and fish laws for protecting habitat through various state laws and for protecting citizens' health, safety, and property through enforcement of, and education about, various recreational laws. It also conducts safety inspections of vessels carrying six or fewer passengers for hire as a complement to federal regulations in this area. In addition, the Division maintains a specialized unit for investigation of organized and commercial poaching rings.

Requires reports to be put on the Internet.

Sec. 209. American Made Goods and Services

Urges the Department to purchase American-made goods and services if they are of comparable quality.

Sec. 210. Department Grant and Loan Programs

Requires a report that includes a description of available grant and loan programs, criteria used for awards, and a list of recipients.

Sec. 211. Game and Fish Protection Fund Appropriations

Lists appropriations to other state departments from the Game and Fish Protection Fund.

Sec. 212. Restricted Fund Revenue, Expenditures, and Fund Balances

Requires fund revenue, spending, and estimated year-end balances for FY 2000-01 and FY 2001-02 by February 15, 2003, for each restricted fund appropriated in this act.

Sec. 213. Report Retention

Requires copies of all reports funded through this act to be received and provided for public use, following state and federal guidelines.

Sec. 214. Waterways Fund Projects

Requires a report on activities of the Waterways Commission during the previous fiscal year, as well as a list of funded waterways fund projects, be provided to the Legislature and Department of Management and Budget by the end of January 2003.

Sec. 215. Restricted Fund Allocation Plan

Requires a plan for allocating restricted funds among administrative support and regulatory activities on January 30, 2003.

Sec. 219. Game and Fish Trust Fund Transfer to Game and Fish Protection Fund

Transfers \$6.0 million from the Game and Fish Trust Fund to the Game and Fish Protection Fund.

Sec. 301. Commission Per Diem Payments

Authorizes per diem payments (\$75 per day) for the Natural Resources Commission.

Sec. 302. Habitat Improvement Projects

Requires wildlife and fisheries habitat improvement projects to be reported to the Legislature on June 15, 2003.

Sec. 401. Engineering Service Charges

Allows a standard percentage fee to be charged against a capital outlay or special maintenance appropriation to recover actual engineering service costs.

Sec. 402. Fish Advisories in the Fishing Guide

Requires the Department to include the website address for information on fishing advisories issued by the Department of Community Health.

Sec. 403. Land Acquisition Fee Charges

Allows a standard percentage fee to be charged against land acquisition projects to recover actual service costs.

Sec. 404. Land Sale Revenue

Creates the Land Sale Fund and directs an amount equal to the cost of personal services, printing, postage advertising, contractual services, and facility rental related to the disposal of tax-reverted properties to be deposited into the fund from land sales revenue.

Sec. 601. Livestock Loss Indemnification

Directs that reimbursement for livestock losses caused by wolves be provided to the Michigan Department of Agriculture.

Sec. 602. Bovine Tuberculosis (TB) Expenditures

Requires the Department to report the amount spent both on Bovine TB mitigation activities and at the animal diagnostic laboratory at Michigan State University.

Sec. 603. Chronic Wasting Disease

Develops a plan to treat and mitigate the occurrence of chronic wasting disease in wildlife populations.

Sec. 701. Water Control Structure Certification

Directs the Fisheries Division to not interfere with the certification process for dams and other water control structures.

Sec. 702. Stream Habitat Improvement Grants

Appropriates \$758,000 for watershed councils, soil conservation districts, and other nonprofit organizations for stream habitat improvement projects.

Sec. 801. Transfer of Natural Resource Trust Fund Revenue to State Park Endowment Fund

Authorizes the transfer of \$10.0 million (mineral royalty revenue) from the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund to the Michigan State Park Endowment Fund. This transfer is required by Section 1902(2) of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, MCL 324.1902.

Sec. 802. Federal Community Service Grants

Allows the Department to receive and use federal grants through the AmeriCorps or Homeland Security grant programs for the Michigan Civilian Conservation Corps.

Sec. 803. State Park Campground Closures

Requires detailed reports to be prepared for construction projects involving campsite or campground closures. Requires notice if the Department intends to reduce operations or reduce recreation opportunities at any state park or recreation area.

Sec. 901. Timber Marking

Directs the Department to mark 63,000 acres at an average rate of 12.5 to 13.0 cords per acre. Consideration shall be given to the impact of timber harvesting on wildlife habitat and recreation uses. Requires an annual report.

Sec. 902. Old Growth Forests

Defines "old growth" and encourages the Department to develop an old growth forest stewardship strategy.

Sec. 903. Contract Foresters

Allows the Department to hire contract foresters to mark timber.

Sec. 904. Federal Forest Management

Appropriates federal funds if the Federal Government delegates management responsibility for National Forest lands to the State of Michigan.

Sec. 905. Adopt-a-Forest Program

Directs the appropriation for the Adopt-a-Forest program to be used to cover the cost of disposing of waste material collected from state forest lands.

Sec. 906. Dispersed Camping Fees

Prevents the Department from charging forest camping fees for dispersed camping in Michigan state forests.

Sec. 907. Abandoned Mine Shaft Closures

Appropriates \$350,000 GF/GP for Abandoned Mine Shaft Closures.

Sec. 1001. Snowmobile Enforcement Grants

Provides snowmobile law enforcement grant funds to county law enforcement agencies in counties with state snowmobile trails.

Sec. 1051. Payments in Lieu of Taxes - VETOED

Appropriates Environmental Protection Fund revenue (\$1.9 million) to pay taxes assessed on lands purchased by Department of Natural Resources.

Sec. 1101. Local Fire Protection Grants

Awards federal rural fire protection grants to eligible local fire protection departments and fire protection districts with populations less than 10,000 and with publicly-owned forested land.

Sec. 1102. Federal Mineral Royalty Payments to Local Governmental Units

Appropriates funds received from the Federal Government for pass-through grants from federal mineral royalties for local transportation and education programs.

Sec. 1103. Federal Land and Water Conservation Fund Grants

Coordinates federal land acquisition grants with Natural Resources Trust Fund grants so as to minimize the matching requirements for local governmental units.

Sec. 1104. ORV Regulation

Appropriates \$25,000 to counties to regulate ORV use near Michigan state parks.

Sec. 1201. Information Services Rate and User Fee Schedules

Requires Department of Information Technology to establish fee and service rate schedules for standard services and information system support provided to state departments.

Sec. 1202. Information Technology Appropriations Work Project

Designates appropriated funds for Information Technology as a work project.

Sec. 1301. Early Retirement and Budgetary Savings

Directs Department savings from the early retirement and mandated general fund reductions to be realized through legislative transfer process.
