GLOSSARY

Frequently-Used State Budget Terms

Adjusted Gross

Total net amount of all line item gross appropriations less (or minus) interdepartmental grants (IDGs) and intradepartmental transfers (IDTs)

Boilerplate

Specific language sections contained in an appropriations act which direct, limit or restrict line item expenditures, and/or require reports

Budget Stabilization Fund (BSF)

The countercyclical economic and budget stabilization fund—also known as the "rainy day" fund

Federal Revenues

Federal grant or matchable revenues dedicated to specific programs

General Fund/General Purpose (GF/GP)

The state's primary operating fund; the portion of the state's General Fund that does not include restricted revenues

Gross Appropriations (Gross)

The total of all applicable line item spending authorizations

Interdepartmental Grant (IDG)

Revenue or funds received by one state department from another state department (usually for a service the receiving department provides)

Intradepartmental Transfer (IDT)

Transfers or funds being provided from one appropriation unit to another in the same department

Lapses

Unspent/unobligated funds remaining in line item accounts at the end of the fiscal year

Line Items

Specific funding amount in an appropriations bill which establishes spending authorization for a particular program or function (may be for a single purpose or for multiple purposes)

Local Revenue

Revenues from local units of government

State Restricted (Restricted Funds)

State revenue dedicated to a specific fund; revenue which results from state mandates or initiatives; used for used for specific programs pursuant to the Constitution or statute

Private Funds

Revenues from non-government entities such as rents, royalties or interest payments, payments from hospitals, payments from individuals, and gifts and bequests

School Aid Fund (SAF)

The primary funding source for K-12 schools and Intermediate School Districts (ISDs)

Work Project

An account established to allow for certain specific unspent funds to be carried over from one fiscal year to a succeeding fiscal year or years

Encourages the Department to sell or lease land occupied by the Roscommon Airport.

Sec. 407. License Sale Credit Card Sale Subsidy

Requires the Department to provide a commission subsidy to offset dealer cost of credit card license sales.

Sec. 408. Travel Report

Requires a quarterly report on employee in-state and out-of-state travel.

Sec. 501. Bovine Tuberculosis (TB) Expenditures

Requires the Department to report the amount spent both on Bovine TB mitigation activities and at the animal diagnostic laboratory at Michigan State University.

Sec. 705. Porcupine Mountain Ski Hill

Requires a report on the economic impact and financial status of the ski hill in Porcupine Mountains State Park. Operations shall not be altered or ended until the report is issued.

Sec. 706. Farms on State Park Properties

Prohibits the lease or concession of a farm in a state park to for-profit entities employing fewer than three individuals.

Sec. 707. Water Trail Interpretation

Requires the Department to collaborate with the Department of History Arts and Libraries to establish a system of water trails.

Sec. 801. Timber Marking

Directs the Department to mark 63,000 acres at an average rate of 12.5 to 13.0 cords per acre. Consideration shall be given to the impact of timber harvesting on wildlife habitat and recreation uses. Requires an annual report.

Sec. 802. Contract Foresters

Allows the Department to hire contract foresters to mark timber.

Sec. 803. Adopt-a-Forest Program

Directs the appropriation for the Adopt-a-Forest program to be used to cover the cost of disposing of waste material collected from state forest lands.

Sec. 804. Abandoned Mine Shaft Closures

Appropriates \$350,000 GF/GP for Abandoned Mine Shaft Closures.

Sec. 805. ORV Trails Advisory Committee

At least one owner or operator of an off-road vehicle dealership shall be appointed to the ORV Trails Advisory Committee.

Sec. 806. IDG to Department of Agriculture for Cooperative Resources Programs

Requires the transfer of \$1.0 million to the Department of Agriculture from the Cooperative Resources Program to the Cooperative Resources Management Initiatives account for local conservation district forestry programs.

Sec. 807. Dispersed Camping Fees

Prevents the Department from charging forest camping fees for dispersed camping in Michigan state forests.

Sec. 901. Snowmobile Enforcement Grants

Provides snowmobile law enforcement grant funds to county law enforcement agencies in counties with state snowmobile trails.

Sec. 1101. Local Fire Protection Grants

Awards federal rural fire protection grants to eligible local fire protection departments and fire protection districts with populations less than 10,000 and with publicly-owned forested land.

Sec. 1102. Federal Mineral Royalty Payments to Local Governmental Units

Appropriates funds received from the Federal Government for pass-through grants from federal mineral royalties for local transportation and education programs.

Sec. 1103. Federal Land and Water Conservation Fund Grants

Coordinates federal land acquisition grants with Natural Resources Trust Fund grants so as to minimize the matching requirements for local governmental units.

Sec. 1104. ORV Regulation

Appropriates \$25,000 to counties to regulate ORV use near Michigan state parks.

Sec. 1201. Federal Advisory Report

Requests GF/GP transfers to cover the payments to the Game and Fish Fund pursuant to the settlement agreement resolving issues raised in the advisory report issued by the US Fish and Wildlife Service on February 5, 2003.
