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GLOSSARY Frequently-Used State Budget Terms

Adjusted Gross

Total net amount of all line item gross appropriations less (or minus) interdepartmental grants (IDGs) and intradepartmental transfers (IDTs)

Boilerplate

Specific language sections contained in an appropriations act which direct, limit or restrict line item expenditures, and/or require reports

Budget Stabilization Fund (BSF)

The countercyclical economic and budget stabilization fund—also known as the "rainy day" fund

Federal Revenues

Federal grant or matchable revenues dedicated to specific programs

General Fund/General Purpose (GF/GP)

The state's primary operating fund; the portion of the state's General Fund that does not include restricted revenues

Gross Appropriations (Gross)

The total of all applicable line item spending authorizations

Interdepartmental Grant (IDG)

Revenue or funds received by one state department from another state department (usually for a service the receiving department provides)

Intradepartmental Transfer (IDT)

Transfers or funds being provided from one appropriation unit to another in the same department

Lapses

Unspent/unobligated funds remaining in line item accounts at the end of the fiscal year

Line Items

Specific funding amount in an appropriations bill which establishes spending authorization for a particular program or function (may be for a single purpose or for multiple purposes)

Local Revenue

Revenues from local units of government

State Restricted (Restricted Funds)

State revenue dedicated to a specific fund; revenue which results from state mandates or initiatives; used for used for specific programs pursuant to the Constitution or statute

Private Funds

Revenues from non-government entities such as rents, royalties or interest payments, payments from hospitals, payments from individuals, and gifts and bequests

School Aid Fund (SAF)

The primary funding source for K-12 schools and Intermediate School Districts (ISDs)

Work Project

An account established to allow for certain specific unspent funds to be carried over from one fiscal year to a succeeding fiscal year or years

Requires report on departmental policies regarding access to and use of information from LEIN.

Sec. 305. LEIN - Suspected Abuses

Directs that suspected incidents of improper access to or use of information from LEIN be investigated; requires report if such an incident is determined to be an illegal act.

Sec. 306. LEIN - Probation Information

Requires probation information be placed on LEIN; requires submission of any statutory amendments necessary to accomplish that goal.

Sec. 401. Secondary Road Patrol and Training Fund

Requires quarterly report on fund collections and grant allotments, including comparisons of revenue collections to grant distributions, current-year appropriation levels, and prior-year expenditure levels.

Sec. 501. DNA Protocol

Requires Department to distribute its protocol for retaining and purging DNA samples and records to each police agency in state; requires report to Legislature whenever changes are made to protocol.

Sec. 502. Evidence Collection by Health Care Providers

Directs Department to work with specified health organizations to ensure that recommendations regarding evidence collection in sexual assault cases are followed.

Sec. 601. State Reimbursement for Training

Provides that 100% of the determined state reimbursement rate for the Training to Locals program be distributed upon certification by Commission on Law Enforcement Standards.

Sec. 602. Firearms Laws Training

Directs that funds be used from training-related appropriations for the purpose of training State Police troopers and other law enforcement officers on federal firearms laws.

Sec. 701. Fire Marshal Report

Requires report to Legislature, with input from specified fire-related organizations, on quality and adequacy of services provided by Fire Marshal Division under the 1997 reorganization of that division.

Sec. 801. Emergency Management Funds

Authorizes state director of emergency management to expend money appropriated to mobilize resources or provide for the health or safety of any area of the state in which the governor declares a state of emergency or state of disaster; requires report to state budget director on actions taken under this authorization; requires budget director to review expenditures and submit recommendations to Legislature on the need for a supplemental appropriation. Authorizes Department to receive and expend money from local, private, federal, or state sources for emergency management-related activities; requires report to Legislature if additional expenditure authorization is approved.

Provides for private donations to canine unit to be used for purchases to enhance the operation of the unit; states legislative intent that private donations not supplant general fund appropriations.

Sec. 1101. Areas Near a State Prison

States that sufficient money is appropriated to ensure that citizens in vicinity of a state police prison not experience a downgrading of State Police criminal investigation services.

Sec. 1201. School Bus Inspections

Requires report on annual inspections of school buses and other vehicles pursuant to state statute; directs Department to provide certificate to a school system whose buses all receive a 100% successful inspection upon the first inspection of the year.
