GLOSSARY

STATE BUDGET TERMS

Gross Appropriations (Gross): The total of all applicable appropriations (statutory spending authorizations) in a budget bill.

Adjusted Gross Appropriations (Adjusted Gross): The net amount of all gross appropriations after subtracting interdepartmental grants (IDGs) and intradepartmental transfers (IDTs).

Lapses: Appropriation amounts that are unspent/unobligated at the end of a fiscal year. Appropriations are automatically terminated at the end of a fiscal year unless otherwise provided by law.

Work Project: A statutorily-authorized account which allows a spending authorization to be carried over from one fiscal year to a succeeding fiscal year or years—i.e., allows funds to be spent over a period of years.

APPROPRIATION BILL TERMS

Line Item: Specific funding amount in an appropriation bill which establishes spending authorization for a particular program or function (may be for a single purpose or for multiple purposes).

Boilerplate: Specific language sections in an appropriation bill which direct, limit or restrict line item expenditures, express legislative intent, and/or require reports.

REVENUE SOURCES

General Fund/General Purpose (GF/GP): Unrestricted General Fund revenue available to fund any activity accounted for in the General Fund; unused GF/GP revenue lapses to the General Fund at the end of a fiscal year.

State Restricted (Restricted): State revenue restricted by state law or outside restriction that is available only for specified purposes; at year-end, unused restricted revenue remains in the restricted fund.

Federal Revenue: Federal grant or matchable revenue dedicated to specific programs.

Local Revenue: Revenue from local units of government.

Private Revenue: Revenue from non-government entities: rents, royalties or interest payments, payments from hospitals or individuals, and gifts and bequests.

Interdepartmental Grant (IDG): Revenue or funds received by one state department from another state department (usually for a service provided by the receiving department).

Intradepartmental Transfer (IDT): Transfers or funds being provided from one appropriation unit to another in the same department.

MAJOR STATE FUNDS

Budget Stabilization Fund (BSF): The countercyclical economic and budget stabilization fund; also known as the "rainy day" fund.

School Aid Fund (SAF): A restricted fund; the primary funding source for K-12 schools and Intermediate School Districts (ISDs).

General Fund: The General Fund (funded from taxes and other general revenue) is used to account for the ordinary operations of a governmental unit that are not accounted for in another fund.

SECTION 110: LAW ENFORCEMENT

The Law Enforcement Division, through the use of commissioned peace officers, is responsible for enforcing environmental protection and resource management laws, conducting investigations to support environmental lawsuits for cleanups and cost recovery, and conducting criminal investigations into violations of all natural resource and environmental protection laws. The Division enforces game and fish laws to protect habitat through various state laws and protect citizens' health, safety, and property through enforcement of, and education about, various recreational laws. It also conducts safety inspections of vessels carrying six or fewer passengers for hire as a complement to federal regulations in this area. The Division also maintains a specialized unit for investigation of organized and commercial poaching rings.

Sec. 208. Department Grant and Loan Programs

Requires report including description of available grant/loan programs, criteria for awards, and a list of recipients.

Sec. 209. Game and Fish Protection Fund Appropriations

Lists appropriations to other state departments from the Game and Fish Protection Fund.

Sec. 210. Waterways Fund Projects

Requires report on activities of Waterways Commission during the previous fiscal year; list of completed waterways fund projects to be provided to Legislature and Department of Management and Budget by January 31, 2008.

Sec. 211. Game and Fish Trust Fund Transfer

Transfers \$6.0 million from Game and Fish Trust Fund to Game and Fish Protection Fund.

Sec. 212. Information Services User Fees

Directs Department to pay user fees to DIT for technology-related services and projects.

Sec. 213. Information Technology Appropriation Work Project

Designates appropriated funds for information technology as a work project.

Sec. 214. Out-of-State Travel Restrictions

Limits purpose/amount of out-of-state travel in FY 2007-08; requires annual report on January 1 for prior fiscal year.

Sec. 215. American Made Goods and Services

Urges Department to purchase American-made goods and services if they are of comparable quality.

Sec. 216. Firms in Economically Deprived or Depressed Communities

Encourages Department to enter into contracts with vendors located in economically depressed communities, including Baldwin in Lake County.

Sec. 217. Legislative Contacts

Prohibits disciplining state employees who communicate with the Michigan Legislature.

Sec. 218. Rule Promulgation

Requires a report on any policy changes made to implement a public act. Department not allowed to adopt a rule that will apply to a small business if it has a disproportionate economic impact.

Sec. 219. Legal Services

Department denied permission to hire attorney to provide legal services provided by the Attorney General.

Sec. 220. Restricted Fund Allocation Plan

Requires plan for allocating restricted funds among administrative support and regulatory activities.

Sec. 222. Contingency Fund Transfer Authority

Legislative transfers allowed: up to \$3,000,000 federal, \$5,000,000 restricted, \$100,000 local, and \$100,000 private.

Sec. 223. DNR Funding Workgroup

Provides for a 7 person work group appointed by legislative leadership and the Governor. This work group is to develop recommendations for long term funding for the department.

Sec. 401. Engineering Service Charges

Allows fee charge against capital outlay or special maintenance appropriation to recover engineering service cost.

Sec. 402. Land Acquisition Fee Charges

Allows fee charge against land acquisition projects to recover actual service costs.

Sec. 403. Land Sale Revenue

Allows collecting application and transaction fees for exchange or sale of state-owned land; creates Land Sale Fund and directs an amount equal to the cost of personal services, printing, postage advertising, contractual services, and facility rental related to disposal of tax-reverted properties be deposited into the fund from land sales revenue.

Sec. 404. Fishing Advisories

Directs Department to include website address in the fishing guide for fishing advisory information from Department of Community Health.

Sec. 405. Land Transactions

Requires quarterly report to Legislature on land purchases, sales and exchanges.

Sec. 501. Livestock Loss Indemnification

Requires reimbursement to Department of Agriculture for livestock losses caused by wolves, coyotes, or cougars.

Sec. 502. Bovine TB Eradication Efforts

Requires quarterly reports on enforcement actions taken to eradicate bovine TB, relevant scientific studies and the number of deer found to be infected.

Sec. 601. Water Control Structure Certification

Directs Fisheries Division to not interfere with the certification process for dams and other water control structures.

Sec. 602. Stream Habitat Improvement Grants

Appropriates \$758,000 for watershed councils, soil conservation districts, and other nonprofit organizations for stream habitat improvement projects.

Sec. 603. Fish Hatchery Operations

Department required to operate 6 fish hatcheries.

Sec. 701. Natural Resource Trust Fund Transfer

Authorizes \$10.0 million transfer (mineral royalty revenue) from Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund to Michigan State Park Endowment Fund as required by law.

Sec. 702. State Park Campground Closures

Requires detailed reports for construction projects involving campsite or campground closures; requires notice if Department intends to reduce operations or reduce recreation opportunities at any state park or recreation area.

Sec. 703. Defibrillators in State Parks

Directs Department to maintain defibrillators placed in state parks.

Sec. 704. Misuse of Complimentary or Discounted Day Passes

Requires report of cases of misuse of complimentary or discounted day passes provided to elected officials.

Sec. 705. Porcupine Mountain Ski Hill

Prohibits demolition of buildings related to the ski hill.

Sec. 706. Corporate Sponsorship Program

Requires the Natural Resources Commission to create a plan supporting corporate sponsorship of state park assets.

Sec. 801. Abandoned Mine Shaft Closures

Appropriates \$350,000 GF/GP for Abandoned Mine Shaft Closures.

Sec. 802. IDG to Department of Agriculture - VETOED

Requires \$1.0 million transfer from cooperative resources programs to Department of Agriculture for cooperative resources management initiative program for local conservation district forestry programs.

Legislative intent to restore \$20,000,000 from the 21st Century Jobs Fund deleted in FY 2006-07.

Sec. 805. Contract Foresters

Allows Department to hire contract foresters to mark timber.

Sec. 806. Timber Marking

Directs Department, subject to forest certification process, to mark and prepare for harvest, 63,000 acres at an average rate of 12.5 to 13.0 cords per acre; impact of timber harvest on wildlife habitat and recreation uses to be considered; requires quarterly report.

Sec. 807. Jordon River Trail Connection to Village of Bellaire

Requires Department to allow access across state-owned land to allow connection of the Jordon River snowmobile Trail to the Village of Bellaire.

Sec. 808. Federal Forest Fire Compact; Expenditure Authorization

Allows the expenditure of funds for forest fire suppression efforts on federal lands, provided the Department is reimbursed.

Sec. 901. Snowmobile Law Enforcement Grants

Provides snowmobile law enforcement grant funds to county law enforcement agencies in counties with state snowmobile trails.

Sec. 1101. Federal Mineral Royalty Payments to Local Governmental Units

Appropriates federal mineral royalty revenue to support pass-through grants to local governments affected by mineral or forestry development on federal lands; funds to be used to support transportation and education programs; requires annual report.

Sec. 1102. Off Road Vehicle (ORV) Trail Improvement Grants

Requires the expenditure of not less than \$980,000 for the development of new ORV trails.
