










Index of Consumer Sentiment


January 2004 Through January 2009








U.S. Economy Has Lost 1.8 Million Jobs in Four Months







U.S. and Michigan Unemployment Rates



U.S. % Change in Employment


December 2007 Through December 2008




Total Existing Home Sales








U.S. Housing Starts Drop 73% From January 2006








Length of U.S. Recessions

of Months From Peak to Trough








Decline in GDP Steep Compared to Recent Recessions

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What Ends the Recession?

- High oil and gasoline prices helped create the recession, but sharply declining prices are now acting as a stimulus
- Massive federal intervention into financial markets prevented complete financial collapse and will help spur recovery
- Significant federal stimulus anticipated of as much as \$1 trillion over two years, including aid to the states
- Time will also help heal the U.S. economy








Big 3 Losing Market Share






Michigan Vehicle Employment



 - Stability in the auto sector








State of Michigan Revenue Sources

FY 2008-09 Total = \$41,952.4 million






Inflation Adjusted GF/GP Revenue Down 35% Since FY 2000





Inflation Adjusted SAF Net Revenue Down 8% since FY 2000








Sales/Use Tax Share Declining










Sales Tax Revenue



Transportation Revenue






MICHIGAN'S BUDGET





FY 2008-09 Budget Adjusted Gross Funding Sources









FY 2008-09 Appropriations Funding

FY 2008-09 GF/GP*









School Aid Major Spending Categories

Medicaid Impact on Michigan's Budget

- For FY 09, approximately 22.4% of Michigan GF/GP revenue is appropriated by Medicaid
- 1 of 7 Michigan residents were eligible for Medicaid in August 2008
- ◆ 37% of births and 70% of nursing home expenditures in Michigan are financed through Medicaid
- Total state and federal Medicaid appropriation is over \$9.9 billion in FY 09
- Since FY 1999-2000
 - 88.4% increase in Medicaid funding
 - 46.6% growth in Medicaid caseload (495,100 cases)



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
Corrections Budget Increases






Adjusted Gross Appropriations by Fund Source

Excluding federal funds, average annual growth rate = 1.3%






GF/GP Appropriations








School Aid Budget Adjusted Gross Appropriations






Transportation Budget Adjusted Gross Appropriations






School Retirement Contribution Rate






Total Membership Pupil Counts








Revenue Sharing Payments to Cities, Villages, and Townships






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
Statewide Pavement Condition Combined Freeway and Non-Freeway








Reduced State Revenue May Lead to Loss of Federal Aid








Total Appropriations for State University Operations

State University Tuition Rates and State Funding








Constitutional Revenue Limit
