RE: Consensus Revenue Agreement—May 17, 2006

Pursuant to the Management and Budget Act Sections 367(a) through 367(f), the Consensus Revenue Estimating Conference establishes an official economic forecast of major variables of the national and state economies and establishes a forecast of anticipated state General Fund/General Purpose (GF/GP) and School Aid Fund (SAF) revenues.

The conference principals at the May 2006 meeting were the Director of the House Fiscal Agency, the Director of the Senate Fiscal Agency, and the State Treasurer. The Director of the House Fiscal Agency is the 2006 Conference Chairperson.

The attached tables provide a summation of the agreements reached at the May 2006 conference. The consensus estimates will be revised or updated at the January 2007 conference.

Table 1: Consensus Economic Forecast

Provides estimates of various state and national economic variables. The forecast indicates that real gross domestic product (GDP) will grow by 3.5% in calendar year (CY) 2006 and by 2.8% in CY 2007. Michigan personal income is forecast to grow 4.0% in CY 2006 and by 4.2% in CY 2007.

Table 2: Consensus Estimates of GF/GP and SAF

Provides final estimates for FY 2004-05 and revised estimates for FY 2005-06 and FY 2006-07 revenue. Net GF/GP and SAF revenue is estimated to increase \$261.1 million or 1.4% in FY 2005-06 and \$508.0 million or 2.6% in FY 2006-07.

Table 3: Consensus Estimate—Budget and Economic Stabilization Fund (BSF) Calculation

A BSF withdrawal of \$24.8 million is estimated for FY 2005-06. No pay-in or withdrawal is estimated for FY 2006-07. Pay-in and withdrawal from the BSF are based on growth in real adjusted personal income (Management and Budget Act, 1984 PA 431, Section 352).

Table 4: Consensus Estimate—Constitutional Revenue Limit Calculation

Reports calculations of the amounts that revenues exceed or do not exceed the constitutional state revenue limit established in Article IX, Section 26 of the Constitution of the State of Michigan. Total state revenue subject to the limit is estimated to be \$4.55 billion below the limit in FY 2005-06 and \$4.69 billion below the limit in FY 2006-07.

Table 5: Consensus Estimate—Comparison of Pupil Membership Estimates

Reports consensus estimates of pupil membership for FY 2005-06 and FY 2006-07 and notes changes from January 2006 estimates.

Table 6: Consensus Estimate—School Aid Revenue Adjustment Factor and Pupil Membership Adjustment Factor

Reports calculations used to determine the FY 2006-07 revenue adjustment factor which is 1.0278, and the pupil membership adjustment factor, which is 1.0041 for FY 2006-07. The revenue adjustment factor is multiplied by the pupil membership adjustment factor to determine the increase in the per pupil foundation allowance, which is 1.0320 or 3.20%.
