Upon entering into a lawsuit against the Federal Government, either on the States own accord or accompanied by other States, the department of Attorney General must appear before the House and Senate Appropriations Subcommittees on General Government and present the department's findings and discovery material that lead to the filing of the lawsuit as well as the financial cost to the State as a participant in the legal action.
