Civil Service Commission Overview


- Created in Article XI, § 5
- Four governor-appointed members
- Staggered eight-year terms
- Unpaid
- No more than two from a political party
- State personnel director and staff administer
- Guaranteed appropriation for core regulatory work

Constitutional Mandates

(Article XI, § 5, of the Michigan Constitution of 1963)

- Classify positions
- Fix rates of compensation
- Approve/disapprove personal-services disbursements
- Determine candidate qualifications
- Make rules covering all personnel transactions
- Regulate conditions of employment

Budget Requests for FY 2025

- MCSC has requested a continuation budget reflecting only basic changes to economics.
- The governor has also included \$31.5M for a Dependent Care Flexible Spending Account match program for state employees.
- The three-year program could match up to \$2,500 in employee contributions to accounts to pay qualifying care expenses.
- This was added to the MCSC budget based on our role administering the state's FSA program.
- The Office of State Employer will negotiate the program with unions, if adopted, and can answer any specific questions.
