MIOSHA COVID-19 Response

MIOSHA took a collaborative approach to COVID-19 workplace safety, combining extensive education and outreach programs to provide employers the resources they need to understand and implement necessary precautions along with clear and consistent enforcement to keep workers safe.

Education and Outreach

Developed a one-stop online resource:

<u>Michigan.gov/COVIDWorkplaceSafety</u> that provides resources for all workplaces including PowerPoint training programs, sample preparedness and response plan, posters, FAQs, reopening checklists, and more.

- Launched the MIOSHA Ambassador Program to educate and consult at-risk establishments regarding COVID-19 workplace safety requirements, resulting in over 2,100 consultations.
- Conducted dozens of townhalls and webinars with employers, workers and stakeholders.
- Launched the MIOSHA COVID-19 hotline: 855-SAFE-C19. With an average wait time of less than 20 seconds.

Enforcement

- #1 COVID is a <u>Public Health</u>issue MDHHS
- #2 COVID is a Workplace Health issue MIOSHA
- MIOSHA initial enforcement tool General Duty Clause citations.
- After October 2nd Michigan Supreme Court decision on Governor's Executive Orders: MDHHS addressed Public Health issue via Emergency Orders MIOSHA addressed Workplace Health issue via Emergency Rules





Implemented 5 state emphasis programs to focus on specific industries, including:

- Hospitals
- Retail, fitness centers, restaurants and bars
- Offices
- Manufacturing
- Construction

Enforcement





- Developed COVID-19 Emergency Rules to help protect Michigan workers and communities from the spread of COVID. Michigan was one of the first state OSHA programs to issue rules to clarify the safety requirements employers must follow to protect their employees from COVID-19.
- Cited over 90 employers for COVID related violations.
- MIOSHA has investigated over 30 COVID workplace deaths.

Complaints received by MIOSHA enforcement divisions increased over 430%.
