



ANN ARBOR WORKIT HEALTH

WorkIt Health has been supported by MEDC programs since it started in 2015 including early-stage funding from MEDC's Entrepreneurship & Innovation initiative, the Michigan Business Development Program, and our partners at the Small Business Development Center



DETROIT INDUSTRIAL SEWING AND INNOVATION CENTER

Industrial Sewing and Innovation Center began working with Pure Michigan Business Connect in 2019 to create high-tech fashion hub in Detroit. It pivoted during COVID with support from PMBC, producing +550,000 face masks and +500,000 isolation gowns

FY22 supplemental places MEDC in a strong position to continue its work to drive economic opportunity in the state



EXECUTIVE FISCAL YEAR 2023 BUDGET RECOMMENDATION



- \$100 million for business attraction and community revitalization
- \$15.65 million for entrepreneurial support
- \$9.85 million for arts and cultural support*
- \$15 million for Pure Michigan*

One-time Funding:

- \$75 million for Natural Science & Cultural Experience grant
- \$15 million for International Talent Attraction grant
- \$750,000 for State Historic Preservation Office Resilient Lakeshore Heritage program




