Staffing Shortages Aren't New – But They're at Critical Levels



Behavioral Health Emergency Department Survey

- MHA is collecting data on a weekly basis

Patients Awaiting BH Bed in ED (N=68)





Admitted to Medical Surg floor for Medical Reason, Awaiting BH Evaluation (N=11)


Awaiting BH Evaluation in the Emergency Department (N=25)


Medical Issue Resolved, Awaiting BH Bed (N=16)

FY '24: Maximizing Medicaid Match

- Moms and Babies
 - 30% inpatient rate increase for births and deliveries
 - \$34.7m GF/\$118m net hospital benefit
- Professional OB services
 - Targeted increase in OB professional rates to raise them from 95% to 100% of Medicare rates
 - \$1.3m GF/\$3.7m net healthcare benefit
- General outpatient rates
 - 11.7% increase in outpatient Medicaid rates, similar to FY '22 success
 - \$46.5m GF/\$239.9m net hospital benefit

Inpatient Psychiatric Rates

- Increase in inpatient psychiatric rates in a tiered structure using Sec. 1513 workgroup methodology
 \$8.2m GF/\$33.4m net hospital benefit
- Trauma Hospital Funding
 - Creating a new funding mechanism to support trauma cases at Level I & II designated hospitals
 - \$12.2 GF cost
 - \$59.6m net hospital benefit



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
