- > 3,000,000 people in Michigan (CMMS, 2023)
- Disenrolling, and later re-enrolling, beneficiaries is in no one's best interest
- ➤ People who have healthcare coverage are more likely to be able to work (Remler, 2017)

More Thoughts on Medicaid

- Notoriously hard to navigate for providers and beneficiaries
- Redeterminations have been a longstanding problem
- People enrolled in Medicaid are very difficult to connect with
- COVID-19 has exacerbated previously existing issues
- Michigan faces a monumental task, as do other states
- MDHHS is working hard and being creative in problem solving
- Recent experience shows 6.4% of redetermined cases are closed due to ineligibility; 30.4% are closed for procedural reasons*
- Opportunities may exist to streamline processes that will
