This 40,000 square foot facility, formerly known as the Globe Building, provides hands-on recreational experiences for all ages and abilities through a variety of activities, exhibits and simulators. Visitors can see what it's like to try fishing, hunting, camping, snowmobiling, paddling and just about any other activity available at Michigan's state parks, recreation areas, beaches, trails and harbors.



Educational groups can use this giant indoor classroom for active field investigations, developing observation skills and strengthening the scientific process, while fostering an initial love for the sciences.

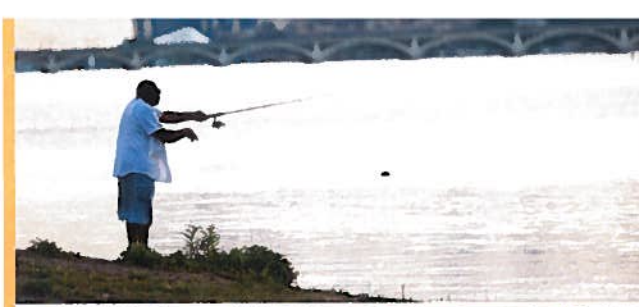

Belle Isle offers many recreational opportunities including fishing, biking, paddling, handball, tennis, baseball, disc golf, soccer, basketball, golf driving range, swimming and more.

- During the summer, the Scott Memorial Fountain sprays water 40 feet into the air and features colored light displays at dark
- The Livingston Memorial Lighthouse stands as the only marble lighthouse in the nation
- Anna Scripps Whitcomb Conservancy features five sections of flora, a formal perennial garden, season floral beds and a lily pond garden
- The Belle Isle Aquarium is the oldest continually-operating aquarium in the U.S., containing 118 species, more than 1,000 fish and an extensive collection of Belle Isle memorabilia
- The Nature Zoo offers a variety of educational programs and close-up encounters with fallow deer
- Explore maritime history at the Dossin Great Lakes Museum
- Early summer through early fall, experience thrills on the Giant Slide, just \$1 per slide or 6 slides for \$5
- A total of 20 reservable shelters for family reunions, business gatherings and other events

This 31-acre urban state park was the first of its kind in Michigan, offering land- and water-based recreation in the heart of downtown Detroit. This facility is located near theaters, Comerica Park, Ford Field, Chene Park, Dequindre Cut, restaurants and much more. The park serves as a gateway, connecting visitors both to popular urban attractions and to our state's natural resources, history and outdoor heritage.
