


Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP) Background

During his Special Message on Public Safety on March 7, 2012, Governor Snyder stressed the need for the program

- Four Michigan cities were ranked among the top 10 most violent cities in the nation
- SYEP would help reduce crime and address juvenile unemployment in those cities

Initial Funding of \$2 Million (PA 236 of 2012)

- (1) From the funds appropriated in Part 1, the department shall award funds to non-government organizations that specialize in the employment of at-risk youth in Detroit, Flint, Saginaw, and Pontiac. The department may utilize the funding to have the at-risk youth participate in outdoor recreation activities consistent with the department's mission. The funds shall be awarded in a form and manner prescribed by the department.
- (2) As used in this section:
 - (a) "At-risk youth" mean individuals between the ages of 16 and 19 who are eligible for the free lunch program.
 - (b) "Department" means the Department of Natural Resources.

SYEP Performance Metrics

- Average of 642 youth in program per year since 2012
- 69% of college eligible youth (high school graduates) went onto college
- 73% of participants returned to high school
- 32% of total participants went on to college or obtained employment


Additional Programming – AmeriCorps NCCC




Partnership with AmeriCorps NCCC (National Civilian Community Corps).

- Awarded 9 service members
- Completed renovation of 4 historically designated cabins at Mill Lake Campground, located at Waterloo State Recreation Area
- Worked with 3 Summer Youth Employment agencies to complete project
- The SYEP has been awarded multiple NCCC teams serving SYEP agencies and DNR State Parks in 2013, 2014, 2016 & 2017!
- SYEP youth learn soft construction skills such as painting, woodworking, and installing floors, ceilings, & doors.
- SYEP participants were able to learn about AmerlCorps NCCC as an option before or during college.
