**Explanation of the position, including any recommended amendments:**

HB 4478 is a reintroduction of a bill we supported last term and allows pet protection in Personal Protection Orders. One of the tactics abusers use to control their victims is to threaten to hurt or kill their pet if the victim leaves. The definition of protected animals is difficult, but this bill provides the court with sufficient guidance to provide protection. The Family Law Section supports this bill.
